Why does it Matter?

Struggling readers

- tend to struggle in all content areas
- may have classroom discipline issues
- often disengage from instruction or lack motivation to complete assignments or participate
- tend to perform poorly on standardized tests
- may drop out of high school Need 4 credits of English to graduate
- may require remedial classes in college which adds to the cost of tuition

Why does it Matter?

Advanced readers

- Tend to read too fast
- Struggle with critical thinking about a text
- Struggle to find appropriate books for their age level
- Can be unmotivated to read
- Often lack the stamina to research and read non-fiction text

Strategies for Reading Success



Reading

- ☐Set aside at least 20 minutes every day to read!
- ☐ Ask questions about what your child has read.
- ☐ Use Lexile level to guide reading choices.
- ☐ Use online resources to motivate and build vocabulary.

- CONTENT AREA: This shows you the subject area(s) in which your student was tested.
- 2 ACHIEVEMENT LEVEL: Milestones results are reported using four categories of achievement that are represented with bar stacks. In previous state tests, achievement was reported in three categories (Does Not Meet, Meets, and Exceeds). Under the new system of reporting, proficiency is the target.

- 10 The "Domain Catagory" is the area of focus tested in the subject area for a particular grade level, for example, Geometry in Mathematics, Geography in Social Studies, or Cells in Science.

What do the levels tell us?

BEGINNING LEARNERS (Level 1)

- Lack important knowledge and skills to be successful in this subject.
- Need <u>substantial</u> support to be ready for the next grade level or course.

DEVELOPING LEARNERS (Level 2)

- Have some of the knowledge and skills necessary in this subject.
- Need <u>additional</u> support to be prepared for the next grade level or course.

PROFICIENT LEARNERS (Level 3)

- Have the knowledge and skills to be successful in this subject.
- Are prepared for the next grade level or course.

DISTINGUISHED LEARNERS (Level 4)

- Have <u>advanced</u> knowledge and skills in this subject.
- Are well prepared for the next grade level or course.
